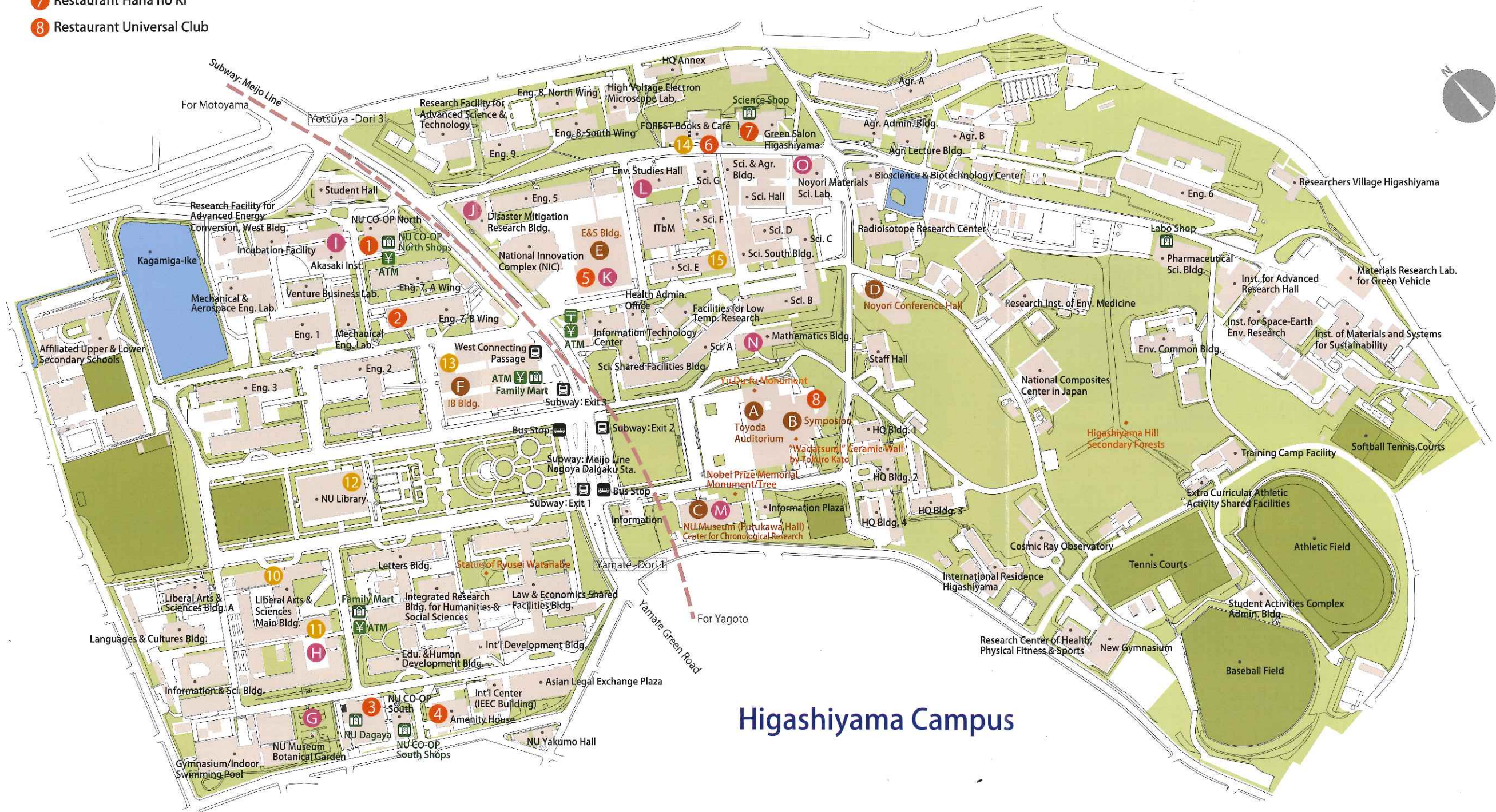

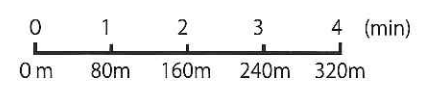

Architecture

A Toyoda Auditorium

The Toyoda Auditorium was donated by the Toyota Motor Industry Corporation in 1960, and designed by the architect Fumihiko Maki. The Auditorium became a 'National Registered Tangible Cultural Asset' in 2011.



B Symposion

The Symposion was built in 1992 to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the University. It was constructed east of the Toyoda Auditorium as a complementary facility for conferences and symposiums.



C NU Museum (Furukawa Hall)

The NU Museum was donated in 1964 by Mr. and Mrs. Furukawa, and used as a university library. The designer of this museum is Yoshiro Taniguchi who also designed the Imperial Theater in Tokyo.



D Noyori Conference Hall

University Professor Ryoji Noyori won the 2001 Nobel Prize in chemistry. In honor of this achievement, the Noyori Conference Hall, designed by Yoshihiko Iida, was built in 2003, and features a hall, lodging facilities, etc.



E E&S Building

The Engineering and Science (E&S) building was constructed in 2011 as a complex research facility. Inside, there are the Kobayashi-Maskawa Institute (KMI), engineering department offices and lecture rooms.



F IB Building

In order to support the world-class education and research, the IB Building (Integrated Building) was built in 2003. Open spaces in the building are designed to create an open atmosphere for visitors to this facility.



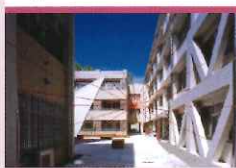
G NU Museum Botanical Garden

The garden was built approximately 50 years ago to grow plants for research and education. Within the 4,230m² of green tracts, over 500 kinds of plants can be seen.

H Liberal Arts & Sciences Building

The art in the courtyard of the Liberal Arts and Sciences Building is "20 points for ten straight crossing" by Felice Varini. People can enjoy this art by seeing the red lines from various spots or angles.



I Akasaki Institute

The Akasaki Institute was built in 2006 to commemorate University Professor Isamu Akasaki's research achievements in developing the blue LED.

J Disaster Mitigation Research Building

The building was constructed as Higashiyama campus' first quake-absorbing structure in 2004. This houses hall, galleries, etc. and is open to the public for seminars and workshops. Open 13:00-16:00 (1st&3rd Tue., and Wed.-Sat.)



K 2008 Nobel Prize Exhibition Hall

The Exhibition Hall is a memorial for Nobel Prize winners: University Professors Toshihide Maskawa, Makoto Kobayashi, and Osamu Shimomura. The Hall displays replicas of the Nobel medals, panels, etc. Open 10:00-16:00 (Tue.-Sat.)



L "Wiechert's Seismograph"

German geologist Wiechert designed the seismograph over 100 years ago. This seismograph was transferred from Kyoto University to Nagoya University in 2007, and is now displayed in the lobby of the Environment Building.



M NU Museum (Furukawa Hall)

The Museum has regular/special exhibitions to introduce the University's archives and research results. It hosts concerts and lectures for next-generation education and international exchange.

N "Big Easy Volume2"

The British designer Ron Arad, designed this unique chair in 1989. The chair is displayed in the lobby on the first floor of the Mathematics Building. Only a limited number of the chairs were produced.



O Noyori Materials Science Laboratory

In the Chemistry Gallery on the 2nd floor, you can retrace the footsteps of University Professor Ryoji Noyori as his career developed, and observe the history of chemistry.
