

## Japan's Amazing Transportation Systems



**91** Chubu Centrair International Airport, Nagoya and Tokoname transit tour

This international airport boasts the highest customer satisfaction in the world and serves as a gateway to the SHORYUDO region

Chubu Centrair International Airport serves as a gateway to the SHORYUDO area. The airport has garnered numerous accolades, including best customer satisfaction for user-friendliness in its class for two years running. The SHORYUDO Tourist Information Center is an information hub for the SHORYUDO area. Chubu Centrair International Airport is the only airport in Japan with a full-fledged public bath. Other than its function as an airport, the facility has a vast number of commercial venues including approximately 120 stores and shops, and hosts a variety of events nearly every day. Located on the shore opposite the airport, Tokoname has many tourist attractions including Mentai Park, an industrial tourist facility for salted cod roe. Costco Wholesale Japan's new branch will be opening summer 2013. Boat Race Tokoname and a ceramics themed walkway can also be enjoyed by visitors either before visiting other parts of Japan or before their departure from Chubu Centrair International Airport.



**93** Ocean cruise (Suruga Bay Ferry and Isewan Ferry)

Elegant cruising and superb ocean views

Visitors can take a ferry cruise, which is an unusual opportunity in Asia. During this pleasant cruise, passengers can enjoy a postcard-worthy landscape. From the ferry in Suruga bay, passengers can see Mt. Fuji over the ocean, while Isewan Ferry offers a gorgeous view of the rows of islands between Toba and Irago.



**94** Centram/Portram (Light Rail Transit) and Fugan Suijo Line

Cutting-edge street car and canal cruise tour

Toyama City has constructed two cutting-edge next-generation tram systems. One circulates through the center of the city and is called Centram, while the other, called Portram goes back and forth between north Toyama and Iwasehama stations. The Centram cars are designed to match the city landscape. Toyama City also has the Fugan Suijo Line, which runs through the Nakajima Lock—designated as a nationally important cultural property. The line offers pleasant cruising with electric-driven boats and eco-friendly solar boats.



**92** Oigawa Railway steam locomotives and scenic valley

Experience a real steam locomotive

The Oigawa Railway offers visitors an opportunity to ride on the genuine steam locomotive in commission today in Japan. The steam locomotive runs through forests, greenery, and alongside the river in idyllic scenery. In addition to the steam locomotive, the Oigawa Railway features an Abt system (rack-and-pinion) railway and the Ikawa Line with its Sekinosawa railway bridge. Because the iron bridge is constructed at high elevation, passengers can enjoy the thrilling scenery below their eyes when passing over the valley. The railway offers passengers a one-minute stop on the bridge to enjoy the spectacular view. Passengers also can enjoy the seasonal landscape along the railway line throughout the year—cherry blossoms and fresh greenery in spring, picnicking at the riverside in summer, beautifully colored leaves in fall, and relaxing hot springs in winter. The railway is linked to the Sumatakyo hot springs resort by bus.

## Influences from Abroad

**95** Fujino Genkuro Memorial Museum (Fukui Prefecture)

Memorial house of Genkuro Fujino, admired as a teacher by Lu Xun

The Fujino Genkuro Memorial Museum is located in Awara City, Fukui Prefecture. The famous Chinese author Lu Xun encountered Fujino Genkuro for the first time while he was in Japan for two years at the Sendai Medical Academy (now Department of Medicine at Tohoku University) and became Genkuro's pupil. Fujino's kindly polite corrections of Lu Xun's notebooks moved Lu Xun, and the master and pupil established a close relationship. Lu Xun later wrote an essay entitled "Mr. Fujino" in memory of his teacher.



**96** National Treasure Buddhist Sutra Repository of Ankokuji Temple (Gifu Prefecture)

Time capsule from China

Hida area's only Buddhist Sutra Repository designated as a National Treasure still houses the Tripitaka (complete Buddhist scriptures) that were imported from China over six centuries ago. A Tripitaka preserved in its original state is extremely rare in Japan.



**97** Shonenji Temple (Aichi Prefecture)

Places related to the Nobel Prize winning Chinese novelist Mo Yan

Shonenji Temple hosted China's first Nobel Prize-winning novelist Mo Yan visited in 1999. This was Mo Yan's first encounter with the head priest. Mo Yan later wrote about the temple in his novels.



**98** Jokoji Temple (Aichi Prefecture)

Chinese-style tomb for a clan founder

Jokoji Temple has a Chinese-style tomb for a clan founder. The mausoleum was designed by the Chinese Ming Period designer Chin Gempin. The mausoleum for the founder of the Owari Clan, Yoshinao Tokugawa (also known as Genkeiko) is designated as a national important cultural asset.



**99** Kenchuji Temple (Nagoya City)

Places associated with Chin Gempin

A stone monument bearing an inscription commemorate the life of Chin Gempin, a naturalized citizen of Japan who came to Japan in the final days of the Ming dynasty and worked for the Owari Clan. Nagoya city is also famous for the Gempin pottery he founded.



**100** Nittaiji Temple (Nagoya City)

Places associated with the Kingdom of Thailand

Nittaiji Temple was constructed to enshrine a thousand-year-old gold-copper Sakyamuni statue designated as a national treasure by Thailand and the ashes of the Buddha, which were presented to Japan by the King of Thailand in 1904. To date, several members of the royal family of Thailand have visited the temple.



**101** Chinese New Year Festival (Nagoya City)

Nagoya festival commemorating the Lunar New Year

The Chinese New Year Festival is Nagoya's largest new year event. The venue attracts people with its Chinese dancing, food, and merchandise.

**102** Aichi Prefectural Gymnasium (Nagoya City)

Places where Japan has established diplomatic ties with China

The World Table Tennis Championship took place in 1971 at the Aichi Prefectural Gymnasium. Players from China were invited, even though Japan and China had yet to establish diplomatic ties. Their participation contributed to the restoration of relations between China, Japan, and the United States. This sequence of events has since been referred to as "ping-pong diplomacy."



**103** Jofuku no Miya Shrine (along with Kumano Kodo) (Mie Prefecture)

Typical Japanese scenery as viewed by Xú Fú

Xú Fú was a Chinese man who traveled far and wide to seek the elixir of life by order of the first Qin Emperor. It is said that he was caught in a storm during his journey and drifted onshore at Hadasu, Kumano. Xú Fú stayed in Kumano thereafter to spread Chinese culture and technology. In the area, there is a simple Shinto gateway called a torii, a small shrine, a stone monument, and a stone engraved with the name of Xú Fú. Along the approach to the shrine, visitors can see some ancient coins used in the Qin dynasty.

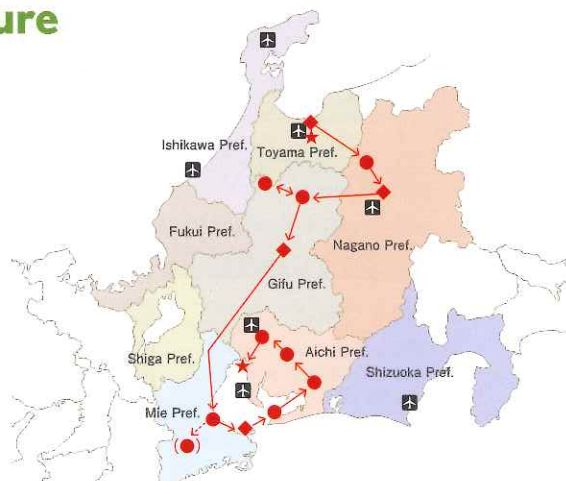
